See Them Before They Go Extinct! Destination: DINO Leaves the Zoo After Fourth of July

July 1, 2016-- Jacksonville, FL – Jacksonville Zoo and Gardens (JZG) is going to have a dino-mite Fourth of July with a BOGO coupon for admission and the last weekend to see Destination: DINO.

The prehistoric exhibit with 25 animatronic, life-like dinosaurs encourages guests to explore the Zoo's backyard as they brave a path through the woods. An herbivorous Triceratops peeks through the foliage while a carnivorous Tyrannosaurus roars to delight the kids. More than one hundred and fifty thousand guests have been delighted by the Jurassic adventure, and this is the last chance to catch the dinosaurs before they go extinct. Admission to the exhibit is \$4 for non-members and \$3 for members.
